The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint John Barnard and Robert Thompson, Esqrs. together with Sir James Calder, Bart. Edward Tucker, and Marmaduke Gwynne, Esqrs. to be His Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Duties on Stamp Vellum, Parchment and Paper.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Frederick Frankland, Esq; the Office of Comptroller of the Duties of Excise, and new Impost, due or payable to His Majesty, within England, Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint John Paul Yvounet, Edward Mountague, Robert Coney, and John Cowslade, Esqrs. together with Marmaduke Sowle, Esq; to be His Majesty's Commissioners for Appeals, and regulating the Duties of Excise.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Henry Talbot, Esq; the Office of Inspector of the Out-Ports Collectors Accounts within England, Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed.

The King has been pleased to constitute David Mallet, Esq; Keeper of the Book or Books, wherein Entries are or should be made of all Ships coming into the Port of London, and of all Warrants of the Customs in the said Port.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Richard Price and Henry Lyte, Esqrs. the Office or Offices of Auditor of Revenues within the Counties of Lincoln, Nottingham, Derby and Chester; and also of Auditor of the Accounts of the Money arising by Writs of Covenant and Writs of Entry in the Alienation Office.

The King has been pleased to grant unto George Bernard Kennett, Esq; the Office of Serjeant at Arms in Ordinary, to attend upon His Majesty's Royal Person.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King; that a numerous Body of Journeymen Shoe-makers did, at different Times, in the Month of January last, assemble themselves at the Houses of several Master Shoe-makers in the City of London and Westminster, and particularly at the House of James Young, of Cranbone Alley, in the Parish of St. Ann, in the County of Middlesex, one of the said Master Shoe-makers, on the 10th of the said Month, and did then and there demand, and insist on, their Wages to be raised Two Pence a Pair for Shoes, which, he, the said James Young, was obliged to promise, through fear or dread of some bodily Harm being done him, or his House being burnt; and that he, the said James Young, did, on the 2d of this Instant February, receive, by the General Post, inclosed in a Cover, an anonymous threatening Letter, directed, on the said Cover, as hereunder, and containing the Words, Letters, and Figures following, viz.

" For Mr. James Young Shoe Maker

" Corner of Cranbone Ally Lester Fields.

" Sir Dam Your Blood if You Do not Ryes Your
 " Worke Too 2 Pence a Pair moor We Will Blow
 " Your Braines out For We Will Blow Your Brans
 " out if You Doo not Do itt You slim Dog We shall
 " sett You Houes on fier and You must Lay Sixty
 " Pound in the Pawn Browker Ally earls Court
 " Ropd in a Bitt Wyte Paper on Thursday Night
 " att Ten a Clock Thee Second of Febr. Dam Your
 " Blod You do not Wee will do itt on Fryday
 " Night." To James Young Cranboones Ally
 " Moors Yard Janr 31st"

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in Writing and Sending the said anonymous threatening Letter to the said James Young, is, hereby, pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person principally concerned in the Writing and Sending the same) who shall discover his, or her Accomplice or Accomplices in the said Facts, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
