Hague, February 4. 'The first Division of His Britannick Majefty's Troops, confilting of the three Regi-ments of Horfe, three Battalions of Foot Guards, and the Regiments of Hodgfon and Barrington, are arrived in the Country of the Generalité, from whence they will be ready to embark whenever the Transports can get to Willemstadt. The fecond Division, confilling of all the Dragoons, had been obliged to halt for two or three Days; but the Weather is fo favourable, that Lieutenant General Conway has ordered them to continue their March ; and we hope they will be able to crofs the Maefe with as much Success as the Troops which have preceded them. The Thaw is fo gentle, that there ferms to be no Danger of Inundations to impede the March ; but hsa paffed Grave.
