WHEREAS the Right Honourable the Earl of Egremont, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hath laid before this Board, an Extract of a Letter from Sir Horatio Mann, His Majesty's Resident at Florence, dated the 12th of last Month, giving Information of a Contagious Distemper having manifested itself in Bosnia, Servia, and other Places near the Confines of Dalmatia, and that the Government of Florence had thereupon subjected every Thing coming from Dalmatia to a Quarantine of Twenty-one Days, in like Manner as had been done at Venice, Rome, Naples and Genoa—His Majesty in Council this Day took the same into His Consideration, and although it appeared, that a Quarantine of Forty Days is at this Time subsisting, by the Orders of this Board, upon all Ships and Vessels coming from or through the Mediterranean into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, yet His Majesty judges it necessary upon this Occasion to cause the said Orders to be enforced: And to that End, His Majesty doth hereby require and command all the Officers appointed for the Service of Quarantine, to use their utmost Care and Diligence in causing the several Rules and Regulations, established for the due Performance of Quarantine, to be punctually and strictly observed, and carried into Execution—Whereof the said Officers, and all others whom it may concern, are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

It is this Day ordered by His Majesty in Council, that the Prohibition on the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder, Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, which was directed by Order of Council of the 17th of September last to be continued till the 29th Day of April next, be taken off.

The Honourable House of Commons having, on Thursday the 17th Instant, come to the following Resolution, viz. "That all Persons interested in, or entitled unto, any Debentures, payable out of His Majesty's Office of Ordnance, which were dated on or before the 31st Day of December last, who shall, on or before the 25th Day of March next, carry the same to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Office of Ordnance, to be certified by him, or his Deputy or Cashier, to the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, shall be entitled unto, and have an Annuity transferrable at the Bank of England, for the Sums due on the said Debentures, after the Rate of Four Pounds per Centum per Annum, to commence from the 25th Day of March next, payable half Yearly, until redeemed by Parliament, the said Annuities to be charged on the Sinking Fund, and the Sums which shall be issued out of the Sinking Fund, for Payment of the said Annuities, to be from Time to Time replaced out of the next Aids to be granted by Parliament."
