

Guardian of the Children of the late Duke Anthony Uric born of this Princess, who is thereby named the only Regent of the Country, and her Mandatary admitted to take the Oath of Guardianship. Consequently, the Imperial Decree, which confirms her in this Quality, is to be dispatched by the Chancery; whilst the Demand of the said Dukes is rejected, and the Regency of Meiningen, the Provincial States, and the Subjects, are enjoined to acknowledge and respect this Princess as their sole Regent. As the Imperial Decrees, relating to the Children of the Duke of Saxe Meiningen by the first Marriage, are reiteratedly confirmed by this; it is also ordered, that the Letter, which the Prince Barnard Ernest, eldest Son of this Marriage, addressed to his Imperial Majesty the 14th of this Month for himself and his Brother, shall be returned by the Chancery, he having made Use in that Letter, of the Title, Arms, Seal, and Name of a Duke of Saxony, contrary to the Imperial Decrees, and the Avis of the Empire in 1747. It is to be remarked, that this Prince and his Brother, since their deceased Mother was raised to the Dignity of Princess by the Emperor Charles VI, have been and are acknowledged for Princes, but not for Dukes of Saxony.

*Ratisbon March 28.* His Imperial Majesty has named Count Seidewitz, Imperial Con-Commissary here, his Commissary for the Election of a new Bishop of Ratisbon; for which Prince Clement of Saxonv, the Bishop of Augsboung, the Provoct of Ellwang, and Count Koenigsfeld, are Candidates.

Yesterday a Column of about 900 or 1000 Croats, commanded by General Kleefeld, coming from the Army of the Empire, passed through this City, and were reviewed before the Palace of the Prince of Tour Taxis; after which they returned to the Island of Unterweerth, where his Highness sent them Bread, and several Barrels of Beer, Brandy, &c. and To-day they embark for Vienna.

*Berlin March 29.* Accounts have been received here, that his Prussian Majesty's Dominions on the Lower Rhine were evacuated by the French Troops on the 13th of this Month. His Serene Highness Prince Ferdinand of Brunswick, who has been for some Time past at Magdebourg, is expected here as this Day.

The latest Letters from Warsaw say, that the King of Poland still continues indisposed.

A great Number of Deserters having formed themselves into different Bands, under Leaders of their own chusing, have thrown themselves into the Woods in Saxony, and have lately committed several Robberies and Murders; so that Travelling in that Electorate, as well as in Thuringia, is at present attended with great Danger.

An Estafette, which arrived here Yesterday, brings an Account, that his Prussian Majesty intends to be here To-morrow Evening.

*Berlin, April 2.* The King of Prussia left Crossen on the 30th in the Morning, and arrived at his Palace here the same Night by Nine of the Clock; where he was received by the Princes of the Blood, Foreign Ministers, and Principal Nobility, &c. assembled for that Purpose.

*Hague, April 8.* This is the Ninth Day of the Prince of Orange's Illness; and his Serene Highness, though very full, is thus far advanced in the Small-Pox without any dangerous Symptoms.
