

## WATER PROOF CLOTH,

By the King's Patent, dated April 1, 1763,

**F**OR the Invention of a Preparation, called Water Proof, whereby to prevent Rain Water from penetrating Woollen Cloth and Hats. It is granted unto Samuel Elmley, of Wakefield in the County of York, Woollen Draper, his Executors, Administrators and Assigns, to have and enjoy the whole and sole Profit, Benefit and Advantage arising from the said Invention or Preparation, for the Time of 14 Years therein expressed; and all Persons, Bodies politick and corporate, and all other Subjects whatsoever, are absolutely forbid, directly or indirectly, the Using, or putting in Practice, the said Invention or Preparation, or any Part of the same, or anywise Counterfeiting, Imitating or Resembling, or Making any Addition to, or Subtracting from, the same, under such Pains and Penalties, as, in the said Patent, are expressed; and further, to be answerable to the said Samuel Elmley, and his Executors, Administrators and Assigns according to Law, for his and their Damages thereby occasioned.
