accompanied by Six Gentlemen of His Majefly's ! Privy Chamber, and from thence brought by Water, in His Majesty's Barges, to the Tower. The Right Honourable Lord Berkeley of Stratton, Constable of the Tower, received their Excellencies at their Landing. The Standard was difplayed; and the Guard being drawn out upon the Wharf, faluted their Excellencies as they passed by : When the Coaches were got off the Wharf, the Guns fired. The Procession began by Six of the Knight Marshal's Men on Horseback; then the Conducting Earl's Coach, in which went Stephen Cottrell, Efg; Marihal of the Ceremonies; then followed Forty of their Excellencies Footmen, in very rich Liveries, Two and and Two; after them Eight Gentlemen of the Bed-Chamber on Horfeback, Two and Two; then the House Steward, on Horfeback; then Eight Pages, Two and Two, on Horfeback ; then the Under Gentlemen of the Horfe ; then their Excellencies Band of Mufick, on Horleback ; then came the First Gentleman of the Horse, immediately preceeding His Majefly's State Coach, in which went their Excellencies, the Right Honourable the Earl of Guildford, and Sir Charles Cottrell Dormer, Knt. Mafter of the Ceremonies; then followed a Leading-Coach of His Majefty's, with the Two Secretaries of the Embally in it; then a Leading-Coach of the Queen's, and one of her Royal Highness the Princel's Dowager of Wales, one of his Royal Highness the Duke of York's, one of her Royal Highnefs Princefs Augusla's, one of his Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland's, and one of her Royal Highness Princefs Amelia's, all drawn by Six Horfes; in thefe Coaches went the Gentlemen of the Privy Chamber, Two and Two : Thele were followed by the State Coach of the most Serene Republick of Venice, very richly ornamented, and drawn by Eight fine Horfes, and Two more very rich Coaches of their Excel-lencies, drawn by Six Horles each, in the last of which went Two Noble Venetians of their Excellencies Suite. A numerous Train of Coaches of the Nobility, each drawn by Six Horfes, clofed the Procession.

When their Excellencies were arrived at Somerfet House, they were complimented on the Part of His Majefty, by the Right Honourable Lord Beaulieu; Majelty, by the Kight Honourable Lord beautier; from the Queen, by the Right Honourable Lord Vifcount Cantalupe, Her Majelty's Vice Chamber-lain; from her Royal Highnels the Princels Dowager of Wales, by William Wentworth, Efq: her Royal Highnels's Vice Chamberlain; from his Royal Highnels the Duke of York, by the Honourable George Welt, Efq; his Royal Highnes's Groom of the Bed Chamber; from her Royal Highnefs Princefs Augusta, by William Egerton, Efq; her Royal Highnefs's Gentleman Ufher; from his Royal Highnefs the Duke of Cumberland, by the Honourable General Fitzwilliams, his Royal Highness's Groom of the Bed-Chamber; and from her Royal Highness Princess Amelia, by ------ Ste her Royal Highness's Gentleman Usher. - Stephens, Elq;

St. James's, April 21. This Day their Excellencies M. Querini and M. Morofini, Ambafladors Extraordinary from the most Serene Republick of Venice, were brought to their Publick Audience of His Majefly, by the Right Honourable the Earl of Suffex, and Sir Charles Cottrell Dormer, Knt. Maller of the Ceremonies, attended by Six Gentlemen of the Privy Chamber, from Somerset House, where they had been as usual entersained by His Majefty for Three Days. The Pro-cession and Ranging the Coaches was exactly the fame as at the Entry. Their Excellencies were received at the Court Gate by Sir Sydney. Meadows, Knt. Marshal; the Foot Guards upon Duty were drawn up in the Court, and their Officers faluted

their Excellencies with Pike, Drum, and Colours, pulling off their Hats as they paffed by. Their Excellencies were conducted to the Little Council Chamber to reft themfelves till His Majefty was ready; and then, having Notice fent by a Gentle-man Usher, they set forward, having the Right Honourable the Earl of Suffex on their Right Hand, and Sir Charles Cottrell Dormer, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies, on their Left. They were received at the Guard-Chamber Door by the Right Honourable Lord Viscount Falmouth, Captain of the Yeomen of the Guard ; at the Drawing-Room Door by the Right Honourable the Earl of Litchfield, Captain of the Band of Gentlemen Penfioners, who were ranged on each Side in the Great Council Chamber, the Room where His Majefty gave them Audience, at the Door of which their Excellencies were received by his Grace the Duke of Marlborough, Lord Chamberlain of His Majesty's House-hold. His Excellency M. Morofini then made an Harangue to His Majefty in Italian, which His Majesty having answered in English, their Excetlencies again retired to the Little Council Chamber, till Her Majefty was ready to receive them, of which having Notice by a Gentleman Ufher, they went to the Queen's Side, and were received at the Door of Her Majesty's Guard-Chamber, by the Right Ho-nourable Lord Viscount Cantalupe, Her Majesty's Vice Chamberlain, and at the Door of the Room of Audience, by the Right Honourable the Earl of Harcourt, Her Majefty's Lord Chamberlain, and fo conducted up to Her Majefty by the Lord Chamberlain, the Earl of Suffex, and Sir Charles Cottrell Dormer; the Audience over, their Excellencies wero reconducted by the Earl of Suffex and Sir Charles Cottrell Dormer, to their own House in the fame State as they came.
