Alicant, April 9. On the 25th past the Trade of this City with England was put upon the fame Foot-ing as before the War; and the Peace was proclaimed on the 27th, to the great Joy of the Inhabitants, and of all People in general. His Britannick Ma-jefty's Subjects have enjoyed, at this Port, all the good Treatment that could be expected, even before the Signing of the Definitive Treaty.

Copenbagen, April 23. The Court of Friedenf-bourg continues in good Health. The Queen Dowager is now fettled at Hirfcholm, and only the two Princes remain at prefent in Town. A new-built Man of War, of 60 Guns, was launched here the 16th Instant, and named the Princels Sophia-Magdalena. The Norway Troops, in this Garrifon, amounting to about 4000 Men, are preparing to return Home, and are to be all embarked on board the Transports now in the Road, by the 3d of next Month. Publick Prayers are offered up in all the Churches, to obtain a Ceffation of the fatal Distemper, which still rages among the horned Cattle.

Berlin, April 26. Laft Sunday Prince Ferdinand of Brunswick fet out for Potzdam, where it is thought he will pass fome Days with his Prussian Majesty. Their Royal Highnesses the Princes Henry and Ferdinand, the King of Prussia's Brothers, as well as the Prince Royal of Pruffia, remain still here.

Hague, May 3, The Prince of Orange went Abroad To-day for the first Time, to the great Sa-The Prince of Orange went tisfaction of the People, and continues in the most perfect Health.

The Prince and Princefs of Weilbourg fet out To day for Germany. Vienna, April 16. We hear that General Zaffrow,

who commanded the Garrison of Schweidnitz when General Laudon carried that Place by Affault, and who left this City a few Days ago, has received, in his Way to Silefia, his Difmiffion from his Pruffian Majefty; and that all the Officers, who ferved un-

der him on that Occafion, have thared the fame Fate. His Pruflian Majelty has named a Council of War to examine into the Conduct of General Finck, with regard to the Affair of Maxen.

The Imperial Artillery, confifting of 40 Pieces of Cannon, which were in Glatz, arrived here the 15th, with all the Ammunition belonging to them. Vienna. April 20. Their Imperial Majesties, who
