#### A PROCLAMATION.

For Pardoning and Discharging Soldiers now in Custody for Desertion.

#### GEORGE R.

W Hereas divers Soldiers, duly enlifted, or in Pay as Soldiers, in certain Regiments and Military Corps, which have been fince difbanded or di fembodied, and in other Regiments or Corps now, fublifting, have deferted Our Service, and thereby incurred the Penalties respectively inflicted for fuch Offence, by feveral Acts of Parliament passed for punishing Mutiny and Defertion : And whereas inany of the taid Deferters have been apprehended at various Times, and committed for fafe Cuftody to the feveral Goals or Prifons belonging to the Countres, Towns, or Places, where fuch Deferters hav been found or app chended, to the End that they might be proceeded against according to Law; the Names of which Deferters have been, from Time to Time, transmit.ed to our Secretary at War for the Time being, purfuant to the Provisions of fuch Acts of Parliament made for Punishing Mutiny and De-fertion as aforefaid : And whereas We are graciously disposed to extend Our Royal Mercy to the faid Of fenders, who may be hereafter uleful to their Country in following their honeit and lawful Occupations, in Cafe they are enabled thereto, by receiving Our free Pardon; and being difcharged out of Cuffody in Confequence thereof; We have therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy-Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, and We do hereby for Us, Our Heirs and Succeffors, pardon and remit all and every fuch Offence and Offences of Defertion, from any, fuch Regiments or Military Corps, committed by any Perfon or Perfons now in Custody as aforefaid : And We do also release and discharge the faid Offenders from all Profecutions, Impriforments, and Penalties, commenced or in-curred, for, or by reafon of any fuch Offence or Offences: And We do hereby, by and with the Advice of Our faid Privy-Council, declare Our farther Pleafure, and do will and require all and every Goaler and Goalers, Keeper and Keepers of any Goal, House of Correction, or Prison, where any such Deterter or Deferters is or are in Custody, to discharge him or them forthwith, without Fee or Re ward, upon receiving a Certificate or Certificates under the Hand of Oar Secretary at War for the Time being, that the Name or Names of fuch Deferter or Deferters, do appear to him to have been transmitted to the W or Office, purform to the Provisions of any of the faid Acts. And We hereby further Charge and Command every fuch Goaler or Keeper, within the Spice of Seven Days after receiving any fuch Cer-tificate as aforefaid, to make a Return to Our Secretary at War for the Time being, of what fuch Goaler

or Keeper shall have done in Pursuance of fuch Certificate, and of this Our Royal Proclamation .- Provided always, that nothing herein contained fhall extend to difcharge any Perfon or Perfons fo in Cuftody for any fuch Offence of Defertion, from any Crime, Caule, or Matter, for which he or they shall have been lawfully committed, or detained in the Cuftody of any fuch Goaler or Keeper, other than fuch Offence or Offences of Defertion.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the 20th Day of May, 1763, in the Third Year of Our Reign.

#### GOD Save the KING.

Berlin, May 10. Separate AS figned by the Plenipotentiaries of her Majefty the Empress Queen of Hungary and Bo-hemia, and of his Majefty the King of Pruffua, in purfuance of the 20th Article of the Treaty of Peace concluded at Hubertsburg the 15th of February 1763.

WHereas it has been flipulated in the 20th Article of the Treaty of Peace, concluded between her Majelty the Emptefs Apoltolick Queen of Hun-gary and Bohemia, and his Majelty the King of Pruffia, bearing Date the 15th of February 1763; that their faid Majesties agreed to include their Allies and Friends in that Treaty of Peace, and that they referve to name them in a separate Act, which should be of the fame Force as the faid Principal Treaty, and fhould in like Manner be ratified by the High Contracting Parties, they would not deferr carrying this Stipulation into Execution : And for that Pur-pofe, her Imperial Majefty Apostolick Queen of Hungary and Bohemia, and his Majefty the King of Hungary and Bohemia, and his Majefty the King of Prufia declare, that they do by Name and exprefly include in the aforefaid Treaty of Peace of the 15th of February 1763, their Allies and Friends, viz. On the Part of her Majefty the Emprefs Apoftolick Queen of Hungary and Bohemia, his Majefty the Most Christian King, his Majefty the King of Swe-den, His Majefty the King of Poland Elector of Saxony, and all the Princes and States of the Em-pire, who are either her Allies, or her Friends;— And on the Part of his Pruflian Majefty, the King of And on the Part of his Pruffian Majefty, the King of Great Britain Elector of Brunfwick Lunenburg, the Most Serene Duke of Brunswick Lunenburg, and the Molt Serene Landgrave of Heffe Caffel.

The High Contracting Parties do likewife include in the aforefaid Treaty of Peace of the 15th of February 1763, her Majefty the Emprets of all the Ruffias, in confequence of the Bands of. Friendship which subside between her and the Two High Con-tracting Parties, and of the Interest which her Ma-jefty has declared that the takes in the Re-establishment of the Tranquillity of Germany.

In Witnels whereof, we the Plenipotentiaries of her Majefty the Empress Queen, and of his Majefty sh¢ the King of Prufia, have, by virtue of our Full Powers and Instructions, figned the prefent Act, which shall have the fame Force, as if it was inferted Word for Word in the Treaty of Peace of the 15th of February 1763, and shall be ratified in like Manner by the Two High Contracting Parties. Berlin, May 14. Laft Thursday her Royal Highnels Princels Amelia, the King of Prussia's Sitter, fet out for Potsdam, where she will remain for some Days, and from thence proceed to Aix la Chapelle for the Recovery of her Health. Some Days ago Count Butterlin, Minister Plenipotentiary from the Empress of Russia to the Court of Madrid, arrived here from Moscow.

Extract of a Letter from Bayreuth, dated the 7th of May, 1763. Yesterday, at Seven in the Evening, our new Margrave, arrived here in perfect Health, preceded by the Light Horse and Hussars. His Serene Highnels was faluted by the Cannon of the Town, and seemed highly pleased with the Dispositions made for his Reception, the Bourgers, Guards. Grenadiers and Fusiliers, being all under Arms.

Hambourg, May 17. As lait Sunday, the 15th, was appointed by this Government for a Day of Thankigiving to Almighty God, on Account of the General Peace, the fame was duly observed in all the Churches in Town, and upon the Territory be longing to this Republick; and in the Asternoon the Cannon from the Ramparts of this City were fired three Times; and at each Time one Hundred Pieces

The new Commandant of Hambourg, Baron de Jahnus, having taken the Oath of Allegiance before the Senate, was acknowledged in that Character this Day Sevennight by the Garrifon, which was drawn up upon the Parade on that Occasion.
