PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act made in the last Seffion of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for the further Improvement of " His Majefty's Revenue of Cultoms ; " and for the Encouragement of Officers making " Seizures ; and for the Prevention of the clan-" defline Running of Goods into any Part of His " Majefty's Dominions, it is, amongit other Things, Enacted, That for the more effectual Prevention of the infamous Practice of Smuggling; and for the better Encouragement of the Officers and Seamen of all fuch Ships and Veffels of War belonging to His Majefty, His Heirs, and Succeffors, who may be employed in preventing the clandestine Running of Goods on the Coafts of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the other Dominions and Colonies, belonging to the Crown of Great Britain, One Moiety of the Nett Produce arising by the Sale of Smuggling Velfels and prohibited Goods, which shall be fo feized after the First Diy of May, 1763, and condemned and fold according to Law, (the Charges whereof being first deducted) shall be vetted in the faid Officers and Seamen ; and His Majefty is thereby empowered to caufe the fame to be divided amongst the faid Officers and Seamen, in fuch Proportions, and in fuch Manner, as His Majefly, His Heirs, and Succeffors, fhall think fit to order and direct, by any Order or Orders of Council, or by any Proclamation or Proclamations, to be made or iffued, from Time to Time, for that Purpofe; and His Majefty is likewife empowered by the faid Act, to make a Dittribution of any other Part of all and every the Seizure and Seizures that shall be made by fuch Officers and Seamen respectively ; the Money arising by the Sale of which other Pait is directed by the faid Act to be paid into the Exchequer. His Majesty, taking the fame into His Royal Confideration, is hereby pleafed, purfuant to the Powers vefled in Him by the faid Act, and by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, direct, and appoint, That the Molety of Seizures, granted by the faid Act to the Officers and Seamen as aforefaid, be divided in the following Proportious; videlicet,

If, With Regard to Seizures made by the Officers , and Men of Ships and Sloops of War.

To the Captain or Captains of any fuch Ships or Sloops, who shall be actually on Board at the Seizure of any Smuggling Veflel, or prohibited Goods, 7 hree Eighth Parts, to be equally divided amongst them; To the Captains of Marines and Land Forces, Sea Lieutenants and Masters, on Board any such Ships or Sloops, Oae Eighth Part, to be equally divided amongit them; To the Lieutenints and Quarter Mafters of Marines, and Lieutenance, Enfign, and

AT the Court at St. James's, the ift Day of Quarter Masters of Land Forces, Boatswain, Gunner, Puiser, Carpenter, Master's Mate, Surgeon, Pilot, and Chaplain, on Board any fuch Ships or Sloops, One Eighth Part, to be equally divided among them; To the Midshipmen, Secretary to Flag Officers, Captain's Clerk, Master Sailmaker, Carpenter's Mates, Boatswain's Mates, Gunner's Mates, Master at Arms, Corporals, Yeomen of the Sheets; Coxswain, Quarter Masters, Quarter Masters Mates; Sur-geons Mates, Yeomen of the Powder Room, and Serjeants of Marines or Land Forces, on Board any fuch Ships or Sloops, One Eighth Part, to be equally divided amongil them; To the Trumpeters, Quartier Gunners, Carpenter's Crew, Steward, Cook, Ar-mourer, Steward's Mate, Cook's Mate, Gunfmith, Cooper, Swabber, Ordinary Trumperer, Barber, Able Seamen, Ordinary Seamen, and Marine of other Soldiers, and all other Perfons doing Duty or affifting on Board any fuch Ships or Sloops, Two Eighth Parts, to be equally divided amongst them.

> 2d, With Regard to Seizures made by the Officers and Men of Cutters, commanded by Lieutenants.

To the Lieutenant commanding fuch Cutter, who fhall be actually on Board at the Scizure of any Smuggling Vessel, or prohibited Goods; One Half Part : To the Second Master and Pilot, or Master's Mate and the Midshipmen, on Board any such Cutter, One Eighth Part; the Second Master and Pilot, or Master's Mate, to have Two Third Parts thereof, and the Midshipman to have the Remainder : But if there flould happen to be a Pilot Extraordinary of Board at the making of any fuch Seizure, the Second Mafter and Pilot, or Mafter's Mate, is, in that Cafe, to have One Moiety of the faid Eighth Part, and the other Moiety is to be equally divided between the Pilot extraordinary and Midshipman. To the Clerk and Steward, Boatswain's Mate, Gunner's Mate, Carpenter's Mate, and Surgeon's Mate, on Board any fuch Cutter, One Fighth Part ; To the Able Scamen, Ordinary Seamen, and all other Perfons, doing Duty and affifting on Board any fuch Cutter, Two Eighth Parts, to be equally divided amongft them.

3.1, With Regard to Seizures made by Ships of Sloops of War in Conjunction with Cutters.

That in all fuch Cafes, the Moiety which is given to the Officers and Men who shall make such Seizure; be divided into fo many equal Parts, or Shares, as there may be Ships or Sloops, and Cutters concerned therein, and that those Shares be distributed to the Officers and Men of the Ships or Sloops, and Cutz ters, according to the aforegoing Proportions:

And His Majefty doth hereby further order, direct, and appoint, That in Cafe any Scizures shall be made in any of the Colonies Abroad, belonging to the Crown of Great Britain, by His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, being Part of the Squadron, or acting under the Orders of a Flag Officer, of a Commo-dore, with a Captain under him, fuch Flag Officer
