

Lisbon, June 22. His Portuguese Majesty about a Fortnight ago reviewed the four Regiments of Cascais, La Lippe, Estremos, and Aveiras, and signified his Royal Satisfaction, by promoting the Colonels, the Marquis de Lavradio, the Viscount de Mesquitella, Preston, and Count de Aveiras to the Rank of Brigadier-General.

The Court has received Advice by the Way of the Brazils, that when the Lord Clive Privateer, Capt. Macnamara, and his Consorts, arrived in the River of Plate, as also the Reinforcement sent by the Governor of the Rio de Janeiro, intended for Nova Colonia de Sacramento; finding the Place taken, they held a Council of War, and determined to attack it. Upon Landing their Men, they were met by a considerable Body of Troops; they routed these Troops, took some Officers Prisoners, and one Jesuit, eight Pieces of Cannon, and several Horses. They attempted the Town of Colonia de Sacramento, and would have carried it; but, during the Attack, Capt. Macnamara's Ship, by some unlucky Accident, took Fire, which obliged the Besiegers to quit their Enterprize. According to the same Advices, the Fleet from the Rio de Janeiro may be expected here by the Middle of next Month.
