**T**HE 20th Advice was received from Esclavonia, that some Turks had entered that Country; and had taken a Piquet of Imperial Troops Prisoners; but it is now assured, that this Invasion was not made by the Turkish Militia, but by a Company of Banditti.

Copenhagen, July 9. Count Schulenberg being appointed his Danish Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary to the Court of Dresden, in the Room of M. D'Oiten, (who returns in the same Character to Petersburg) has now received his Instructions and taken Leave, and is actually upon the Point of setting out for his Post.

Hague, July 15. The Preparations for succouring the Colony of Berbices continue; and the Officers, who are to command, will be appointed in a few Days.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that some Person or Persons, unknown, did, in the Night-time, between the Twenty-ninth and Thirtieth Days of June last, at the Parish of the Holy Trinity in the County of the City of Exeter, in a Rack-Field there, called Fryershayes, wilfully and maliciously cut Five Serges called Half Quarters, of the Value of Eight Pounds, the Property of Ann Moor, of the Parish of the Holy Trinity in the said County of the City of Exeter, Fuller, then and there being on the Racks; and that some Person or Persons, unknown, did, also, in the Night-time, between the Second and Third Days of this Instant July, at the Parish aforesaid, and in the Rack-Field aforesaid, wilfully and maliciously cut Eight other Serges called Pieces and Half, of the Value of Twelve Pounds, the Property also of the said Ann Moor, then, and there, being on the said Racks; and also Four other Serges, likewise called Pieces and Half, of the Value of Six Pounds, then, and there, being on the Racks, the Property of Abraham Kennaway of the same Parish, Fuller; and that all the Serges so cut as

aforesaid were thereby greatly injured, and so as not to be worth One Third Part of the Original Value: His Majesty, for the better Discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in Committing the said Crimes, or either of them, is, hereby, pleased to promise His most Gracious Pardon to any One of them (except the Person who actually cut the said Serges) who shall discover his, or her, Accomplice or Accomplices in the said Facts, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
