*Copenhagen, July 16.*

**L** E T T E R S from Stockholm mention; that the Guards were reviewed before the King and Royal Family, on the 6th Instant, and went through their several Evolutions with great Dexterity.

*Copenhagen, July 19.* The King of Denmark, who has passed Eight Days at the Grand Marshal's Seat at Bregentwed, returned last Night to this City, and pursues his Journey again this Morning to Fridensbourg.

On the 15th Instant arrived the Ship Prince Frederick, belonging to the Asiatick Company, laden with the usual Merchandize from China. Another from thence, called the Queen Sophia Magdalena, is hourly expected.

*Copenhagen, July 23.* According to the Bills of Mortality, this Place is now in perfect Health again; but the Distemper among the Cattle still continues.

The second China Ship, called the Sophia Magdalena, is now safe arrived.

*Berlin, July 23.* His Prussian Majesty left Charlottenbourg the 19th, and is gone to reside at Potsdam, where the Margravine of Schwedt, (the King of Prussia's Sister) and the Princesses her Daughters, are expected in a few Days.

*Hambourg, July 26.* Count Diedrickstein, the Imperial Minister at the Court of Denmark, arrived here a few Days ago from Vienna, on his Return to Copenhagen; for which Place he continued his Route Yesterday.
