*Petersburgh, July 8.*

**T**HE Great Duke is expected this Evening; and her Imperial Majesty is to make her Publick Entry To-morrow.

The new Danish Minister Baron Osten, and the Spanish Minister the Viscount d'Herrera, had their first Audiences Yesterday at the Czarskoffo. Count d'Ahthausen, and the Marquis d'Almodover, took their Leaves at the same Time.

*Petersburgh, July 12.* Her Imperial Majesty made her Publick Entry on Saturday Evening; and arrived at her Summer Palace about Eight o'Clock. The Ambassadors, and the other Foreign Ministers, were there to receive her Majesty. At Night a Firework was played off upon the River Neva.

Yesterday, being the Name-Day of the Great Duke, there was a Ball at Court, and the Foreign Ministers supped with the Empress.

*Petersburgh, July 22.* Her Imperial Majesty goes to Peterhoff To-morrow, where she is to remain three Weeks.

*Ratisbon, July 28.* M. Simolin, the Russian Minister, arrived here the Day before Yesterday from Spa.

According to Letters from Vienna, their Imperial Majesties have appointed Prince Lobkowitz their Ambassador to the Court of Russia.

*Berlin, July 28.* Her Royal Highness the Margravine of Schwedt, with her Daughters the Dutchess of Wurtemberg and the Princess Philippine, arrived last Thursday at Potsdam. Lieutenant General Tauenzien is made Governor of Breslaw, and has got a Regiment of Infantry. His Royal Highness the Prince Royal of Prussia succeeds him as Commander of the first Battalion of Guards.

*Dresden, August 1.* The King of Poland arrived here from Toplitz on Thursday last, in perfect Health, and has since given Audience to the Prussian Minister, and to Count Lynar, Minister of State in Denmark, who intends to pass a few Days here.

His Majesty has been pleased to confer the Dignity of Field Marshal on the Chevalier de Saxe.

*Hamburgh, August 2.* Yesterday a Jager arrived in this Harbour with Four Hundred and Sixty Two Barrels of Herrings, on Account of the Free British Fishery; and notwithstanding the Dutch arrived before at this Market; yet, as the British Herrings are large and well cured, they have sold for a very good Price.

The Reigning Prince of Anhalt Coethen arrived here the Day before Yesterday from Glucksbourgh, with the Dutchess his Consort, the Princess Louise Charlotte of the House of Holstein Glucksbourgh;

and this Morning the new married Couple set out from hence for the Prince's Residence of Coethen:

Prince Lewis, Brother to the Reigning Duke of Mecklenbourg Schwerin, is arrived here, as well as Prince Ernest Frederic, Son to the Reigning Duke of Saxe Cobourg Saalfeld.

*Hague, August 5.* Prince Ferdinand of Brunswick left this Place on Wednesday last.
