According to Letters from Vienna, their Imperial Majesties have appointed Prince Lobkowitz their Ambafiador to the Court of Ruffia.

Berlin, July 28. Her Royal Highnels the Mar-gravine of Schwedt, with her Daughters the Dutchels of Wurtemberg and the Princels Philipine, arrived laft Thursday at Potzdam. Lieutenant General Tauenzien is made Governor of Breflaw, and has got a Regiment of Infantry. His Royal Highnefs the Prince Royal of Pruffia fucceeds him as Commander of the first Battalion of Guards.
