*Fort St. Augustin, August 1.*

**T**HE Day before Yesterday Major Ogilvie arrived here with Part of the 9th and 35th Regiments, under Convoy of the Danae Frigate, from the Havannah, being sent hither by General Keppel to relieve four Companies of the Royal commanded by Captain Hedges, who had before taken Possession of this Fort, upon the Surrender of the Spaniards. Major Ogilvie has sent Part of the 35th Regiment to take Possession of Pensacola likewise.

*Petersbourg, August 9.* The Empress is expected in Town To-morrow, as the incessant Rains have made her Residence at Peterhoff very disagreeable.

The Chancellor is preparing to set out in a few Days on his Way to Italy.

The Swedish Minister, Baron Possé, has had his Audience of Leave, and is going away immediately.

*Copenhagen, August 23.* The last Accounts from Stockholm mention the Arrival of two China Ships at Gottenburg, the 10th of this Month.

The King of Sweden, who has been ill of a Fever, is now perfectly recovered, but has not yet been Abroad.

M. Dallin, known in the Literary World by the First Volume of A History of Sweden, died at Dronningholm the 12th Instant, greatly regretted.

*Berlin, August 27.* On Tuesday last his Prussian Majesty arrived here from Potsdam; and the same Day Lieutenant General Ried, Envoy Extraordinary from the Court of Vienna to this Court, had his First Audience of his Majesty.

M. Hellen, the Prussian Minister at the Hague, having obtained his Letters of Revocation, the King of Prussia has appointed M. Thulmeyer, Councillor of Legation, his Envoy Extraordinary to the States General.

It is reported here, and divers Letters from Poland confirm the same, that a Corps of 16,000 Russians have entered Lithuania.

*Hamburg, August 30.* The Marquis d'Almadovar, late Envoy from the Court of Spain to That of Petersburg, has passed through this Place in his Way to Madrid, whither he has Orders to repair as soon as possible, his Catholick Majesty having nominated him his Ambassador Extraordinary to the Court of Lisbon.

St. James's, September 2, 1763.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That, within these Twelve Months last past, there have been several Tumults and Riots in, and about, the Parish of Christ Church in the County of Middlesex; That, in particular, on Wednesday the 24th of August

last, a great Number of Persons assembled about the House of one Joseph White, in Lamb Street in the said Parish, and, in a most outrageous and riotous Manner, broke all the Windows of the said House; and, about Three o'Clock in the Afternoon of the same Day, brought the Body of one Cornelius Saunders (who had been executed, that Day, at Tyburn, for Stealing out of the Dwelling-House of the said White upwards of Fifty Pounds,) and laid it before the Door, and, in the Evening of the same Day, broke open the said House, and took out all the Forms, Tables, Benches and other Things which were in the lower Part of the said House, and made a Bonfire before the Door, and burnt a Quantity of Linnen; and, also, pulled down and destroyed the Wainscot, Flooring and Stairs of the said House; and, on the next Day, assembled again, and could not be dispersed till near Midnight: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said outrageous and dangerous Riot, and in the Taking out of the said Goods, and burning them in the Manner aforesaid, is, hereby, pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of them, who shall discover his, or her, Accomplice or Accomplices in the said Facts, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
