Crifp and Briggs, Officers of Excise at Frewersham in the County of Kent, having, upon the 7th of August last, observed a Gang of Smegglers, of about Fistern in Number, going over Chareing Heath in the faid County, called a Milita Man and Iwo others to their Affiftance, and after purfying for forecal Mies the Track which the faid Gang had gone, they deformered, in a Field, Sixty-two Bags of Tea, which they immediately fecured in a Farm-Houfe; but prefently the whole Gang of imagglers came up, and declared they would refeue the Goods, or wish the Atenty I The Officers of Excise being determined to defend their Saigues, profled them to determine to the Smurg. fend their Seizure, pressed them to depart; the Smugglers nevertheless attempted to break into the Heuse, which they, in Part, effected, by forcing out the Bars of the Windows; and they were entering in, threatening, with Oaths and Imprecations, that they would murder the Officers, who were thereupon obliged to fire, upon which they were dispersed, and the Officers secured their Seizure: In order to bring to Justice the Persons concerned in the above Attempt, His M jesty is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his Accomplise or Accomplices therein, so that be, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
