N Wedneiday Two Men of War of Sixty Guns were launched. Her İmperial Ma-jefty, the whole Court, and all the Foreign Ministers, were present.

Venice, September 9. Letters of the 7th from Ve-rona inform us, that the Aultrian Troops, which to the Number of 7000 had entered the Venetian Territories, returned on Sunday Night with a General at their Head; that they have flopt all the Mills, and have placed Detachments all along the Tartato; that the greatest Numbers, to the Amount of 4000 Men, were at the Island of Scala; and that 600 were advanced within five Miles of Verona: The Dispute concerned the Allowance of a suffici.nt Quantity of Water for the Rice Grounds. Venice, September 16. The Difference subsisting

between the Venetians and the Mantuans is at prefent quieted; and the Auftrian Troops are marched off the Territory of the Republick. not having any Pretence to flay any longer, as the Water is taken off the Rice Grounds at this Seaton of the Year.

By a Ship arrived the Day before Yelterday we hear, that there has been a great File at Smyrna, which has deftroyed a great Part of the Town, and

that the European Merchants have fuffered extremely. Lifton, September 12. The Baron de Haaften, Liston, September 1.2. The Baron de Haasten, Minister from the States General, had his First Audience of the most Faithful King and Queen, and the

Royal Family, on Saturday. Drefden, September 13. The Russian Regiments, which had entered Lithuania, began their Retreat from thence the 5th of this Month, in purfuance of Orders fignified to them by Count Keyferling, Am-baffador from the Empress of Ruffia at Warfaw.

Turin, September 17. The King of Sardinia, the Duke of Savoy, and the Duke of Chablais, left Turin on Monday laft, in order to vifit fome Places on the Frontiers of Piedmont.

Dublin Cafile, September 22, 1763. His Excellency the Earl of Northumberland, Lord Lieutenant of this Kingdom, arrived here early this Morning: His Excellency was received at Landing by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Sheriffs of Dublin; the Foot Forces in Garrifon, lined the Streets, and His Excellency (attended by a Squadron of Horle) proceeded amidit the Acclamations of the People, with the ufual Ceremony, to the Calle, where, in Council, His Excellency took the Oaths appointed to be taken by the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, and received the Sword from their Excellencies the Lords Juffices. After which the Great Guns in His Majesty's Park the Phœnix were fired, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments on Duty, which were drawn out upon the College Green: And His Excellency repairing to the Prefence Chamber, received there the Compliments of the Nobility and other Perfons of Diffinction upon his fafe Arrival to take upon him the Government of this Kingdom.

The additional Mails will be dispatched, from this

Office, for Edinburgh, on Mondays and Fridays; the Monday's Mull will arrive at Edinburgh on Fridays, and the Friday's Mail on Mondays.

The additional Mails, from Edinburgh, will be dif-patched for England, on Tuefday and Friday Evenings; the Tuefday's Mail will arrive at this Office on Saturdays, and the Friday's Mail on Turfdays

And whereas great Numbers of Letters bave bitherto been privately collected and derivered, as well in this Kingdom as in Scotland, contrary to Law, and to the Prejudice of the Revenue of this Office, Notice is bereby given, that all Carriers, Coachmen, Watermen, Wher-rymen, Difperfers of Country News-papers, Higlers, and all other Persons what soever, hereafter detected in the illegal Collecting, Conveying, or Delivering of Letters and Packets, will be profecuted with the utmost Severity.

The Penalty is Five Pounds for every Letter colletted or delivered contrary to Law; and One Hundred Pounds for every Week Juch Pratice is continued.
