The Perfort who committed this Robbery are described to be, one of them rather a tall Man, dreffed in a light-coloured Fusian Frock, a black or dark brown Wig, a flouched Hat, and pitted with the Small Pox; the other, rather a flort Man, dreffed in a Sailor's Jacket, with a great Number of small Buttons, a Hat upon his Head, and a checked Shirt on.

The additional Mails will be difpatched, from this Office, for Edinburgh, on Mondays and Fridays; the Monday's Mail will arrive at Edinburgh on Fridays, and the Friday's Mail on Mondays.

"The additional Mail:, from Edinburgh, will be difpatched for England, on Turflay and Friday Evenings; the Turflay's Mail will arrive at this Office on Saturdays, and the Friday's Mail on Turflays. And whereas great Numbers of Letters have bitherto

Kingdom as in Scotland, contrary to Law, and to the Prejudice of the Revenue of this Office, Notice is bereby given, that all Carriers, Coachemen, Watermen, Wherrymen, Difperfers of Country News-papers, Higlers, and all other Perfons whatfoever, hereafter detected in the illegal Collecting, Conveying, or Delivering of Letters and Packets, will be projecuted with the utmoff Severity.

The Penalty is Five Pounds for every Letter collected or delivered contrary to Law; and One Hundred Pounds for every Week fuch Practice is continued.
