N Thursday his Sicilian Majesty came to Naples, to celebrate the next Day the Feast of St. Charles. This being the Name-Day of the King of Spain, was kept as a great Holiday at Court; and, in the Evening, his Sicilian Majesty assisted at the Representation of a new Opera. The following Day his said Majesty returned to Portici, when a Mourning of Six Months was immediately declared at Court for the Death of the late King of Poland.

St. James's, December 6. The Most Christian King having upon His Ambassador Count de Guerchy's Arrival here, fent to the Chevalier d'Eon de Beaument, who had the Character of Minister Plenipotentiary at this Court, His Revocation from hence, with a Letter addressed to His Britannick Majesty; and having been informed, that M. d'Eon perfished in refusing to pay Obedience to His Orders, and to present the King His Master's Letter ; His said most Christian Majesty thereupon wrote a Second Letter to the King, and commanded His Ambassador to present the same immediately; which having been accordingly done, His Majesty has been pleased to declare, That the said M. d'Eon has no longer any Character here, and has forbid him the Court.
