On the Representations that have been made by feveral Electors, of the great Expence and Inconveniency of holding the Congress at Augsbourg, it has been resolved to transfer it to Frankfort; and the Elector has issued out Letters for convoking it at that Place the 7th of January 1764 in order to consider of the Election of a King of the Romans.
