PON receiving an Account from Caffel Abbadaffe in the Territory of Spalato, that in a Family there two Perfons had died with evident Marks of a pefilential Diftemper, fuppofed to have been brought thither by a Hide received from Udovifeich in the Country of Sign, the Magistrates of Health have laid a Quarantaine of 40 Days upon all Vesfels coming from Dalmatia, with its Iflands, together with those of the Bay of Quarter, the Gulph Cattaro, Caffel Nuovo, and Ragufa.
