London,Oftab, 29. His day, according to the usual Custom, Sir Fofeph Sheldon Knight, Lord Mayor Bleet, accompanied with the Aldermen and Sheriffs of the City attended by the Mallers, War-dens, and Liveries of the feveral Companies in their respective Barges, adorned with Banners, Streamers, Colours, Escurcheons, and other Ornaments, went to Westmenster, and having there taken the ac-sustomed Oath, returned again by water to Fauls Wharf, and from thence passed through Cheapside, to the Guild-Mall, with the usual Solemnity'; which was this day wery extraordinay in all its circumstances : their Majesties; accompanied with their Royal Highnesses, and attended by many of the principal Nobility, and other Persons of Quality, having been pleased according to the humble Invitation of the City, to Honour them with their presence, first at the Show in Cheapfide, (being placed in a Balcony under a Canopy of State, near the Standard, till the whole Cavalcade was passed) and afterwards at the Guildhall at Dinner, where the Entertainment was great and magnificent in all kinds, greatly to the fatifction of their Majeslies, their Royal Highnesses, and all the Nobility and other Persons of Quality that were there present. And as a farther mark of His Majessles Grace and Favor to the Ci y, His Majesty was pleased to confer the Honour of Knighthood upon the two Sheriffs, Sir Thomas Gold, and Sir John Shorten, as likewife upon Sir PatienceWard Alderman.

Madrid, Octob. 13. From Caliz we have advice, that the eight instant, Lieutenant-Admiral de Ruster failed from thence, to the Eastward, with 12 Men of War under his command. The Portugueze Armada returned

the II instant to Lisbon.

Vienna, Od b. 20 The Emperor defiring to have an interview with his lifter, the Queen Dowager of Poland, Nictasbourg in Moravia is appointed for the place; and the 22 of the next Month, the Emperor intends to begin his journey thicher, accompanied with the Empressreigning, and the Empress Dowager; and in the mean time, the Prince of Dietrichstein, Great Mafter of the Empresses Houshold, is gone thither, to prepare things for the reception of their Majesties. Count Mansfelde lent bliber by General Montequeuli, to inform the Emperor of feveral matters concerning the state of the Afmy is feill here, but presses his departure, which, it's thought, will be in a day or two. The 38 of the next month, the Emperor has appointed an Assembly to be held of the Princes of the Empire, though we yet know not, who is to affid at it on the part of his Imperial Majesty. The Baron de Goes Bishop of Gurck in Stiria, is declared firft Plenipotentiary of hi Imperial Majetty, for the Treat of Peace.

Philippburgh, Offab 23. The Enemies continue to

Philipsburgh, Octob 23. The Enemies consinue to lodge themselves on all sides sous, and fortified the quarters which they have taken at scaffure, Vity lock, ane Midleberg, with defign wholly to thue us up; which hitherto they have not been able to effect, and our parties are frequently abroad : our Governor, the Sieur de Fay, apprehending left the Enomies might like wife, make

themselves Masters of Graves, a minit Town belonging to the Marquis of Baden Dourlach, fent out a party, who burnt it to the ground, to deprive the Imperialists of a Post which would have been as profitable to them, as oifadvantagious to us. General Montecuculi has caused his Bridge at Lauterburg to be taken in pieces again; and we are told that the Imperial Acmy Justers much wanting all things necessary for its sublistence.

Majence, Offob. 26. The Circle of Franconia refeles to grant the Imperialists Winter-quarters, and raisfes Men, as if those States intended to oppose the same with force. The Duke of Samen Lawendurg, the March grave of Baden Barest, and the General Major Van Seyt, have received orders from the Emperor to

block up Philipsburgh on all sides.

Strasburgh, Octob 28. The French have not as yet passed any of their Troops over the Rhine at Brisac ; and we hope the Imperial Troops which affemble near Friburg will hinder them, as least from making any con-fiderable incursions on that side. The Prince of Condo does not yet move out of his quarters at Kaftenholig ; and, according to the advice we have here, his Cavalry is in no very good condition, many of them being dif-mounted. Two hundred Imperialifts have politified themselves of the little Isle which lies in the Rhine over against Drusenheym; and 600 Imperial Horse have posted themselves at Grunsheym, three League from Haguenam, the Garison of which place hath lately been reih-forced to 3000 Men. The French fortific Schlestadt again, and continue to make great provision at Brijac.

Spire, Offeb. 29. The Imperialifts have made up again their Bridge at Lauterburg. We know not yet when they will decamp; in order to which, it's thought, General Montesweuls first expects the return of Count Mans fillt from Vienna, and the orders he shall bring from thence concerning the Winter-quarters. The French in Philipsburgh begin to be very closely blocked up; one of their parties who ventured abroad the other day, was The Troops of the defeated, and 15 taken Prisoners. Circles that are quartered in Bruchfallare endeavouring to turn the little River of Zalize, which supplies that place with water. General Montecuculi has fent 1000 Men to reinforce the Duke of Lorrain. Those that come from the Imperial Camo tellus, I hat the Horse age in great want of Forage, and that the Troopers are forced to go eight or nine Leagues for it.

Cob ents, Offob. 30. Our Letters from Alfatia, of the 26 inflant, inform us, That the French and Imperial Armies continued ftill at Kaftenholtz, and at Offichhach's That General Montecounti was pretty well recovered of his illness of the Gour. The Duke of Lorrain is marching with his Forces towards Kayfer flauterne, and 1000 Imperialiffe, sent from the Imperial Camp at Offenbach, are on their way, as we are told, to join him. The Mareschal de Rochesort, who was with 2000 Men at Sarbrucke, is retired again towards Meiz: The Munfter Troops that were employed in the fiege of Trepes, have their quarters in the Countrey of Veldenty on the Moselle.
