Feb. 14, Tuelday, The Ambassador goes in Ceremony, from the aforefaid Houfe, to a Publick Audience, in which he makes a Demand of the Infanta. At Night Fireworks or Entertainments at the Buen Retiro.

Feb. 15, Wedneiday, The Marriage Contract is fign-ed, Fireworks or Entertainments at the Buen Ret. 10.

Feb. 16, Thursday, The Nuprials. Fireworks again, or Entertainments at the Retiro.

Feb. 17, Friday, First Festival at the Count of Rofemberg's.

Feb. 18, Saturday, Second Festival at the Count of Rofemberg's.

- Feb. 19, Sunday, The Court kifs Hands in the Morning. In the Afternoon the King and Royal Family go in great Solemnity to return Thanks at the Church of Atocha.
- Feb. 20, Monday, Third Entertainment at the Count of Rofemberg's.
- Feb. 21, Tuesday, Day of Rest between Count Rofemberg's Feltivals, and thole of the Prince de la Catholica. Ambassador from Naples.

Feb. 22, Wednefday, Entertainment of the Prince de la Catholica.

Feb. 23, Thursday, The Tribunals kils Hands. Feb. 24. Friday, Entertainment of the Marquis d'Oilun, Ambaffador from the Fren h Court.

Feb. 25. Saturday, The King and Court return to the Pardo.

The Ambaffadors of the three Courts will have Fireworks, ard give a Play in Theatres which they have fitted up for the Occasion within their Houses,

which will be followed by a great Supper, and a Ball. Turia, February 15. His Royal Highnefs the Turia, February 15. His Royal Highnefs the Duke of York, is arrived in this Capital in perfect Health : Notwithflanding his Wifthes to maintain a private Character, it was impossible to avoid his being received at Alexandria and Afti, the two chief Towns through which his Royal Highnefs paffed, with all poffible Marks of Refpect and Diffinction. At some Distance from the first, the Commandant met him with two Coaches and Six, complimented him in the Name of the King, and conducted him to the Governor's Houfe (he being absent upon Account of his Health) where his Royal Highnels was received by the Officers of the Garrison and chief Nobility of the Place, and entertained magnificently. In entering the Town, he was faluted with Thirty Discharges of Cannon, the Guard at the Gate prefented their Arms, and the Officer faluted him; a Captain's Guard was mounted, and all other Honours paid him in Proportion : During his Royal Highness's Stay at

Alexandria, he defired to fee the Citadel, which his Sardinian Majelly has rendered a complete Work at a great Expence. Upon his Royal Highnels's Departure, he was faluted with the fame Number of Cannon, and received the fame Honours at the Gate as at his Entrance. At Affi, he met with the fame At the first Post from Turin, he was Treatment. met by the Master of the Ceremonies, and his Deputy. in Two of his Sardinian Majefty's Coaches, and conducted to the Palace prepared for his Reception on Sunday laft at Noon, and foon after complimented on his fafe Arrival, on the Part of the King, the Duke of Savoy, and the reft of the Royal Family.

The Foreign Ministers refiding at this Court went in a Body to pay their Respects to his Royal High. nefs; after which his Royal Highnefs was conducted to Court by the Mafter of the Ceremonies and his Deputy, in Two of his Sardin'sn Majesty's Coaches, attended by Mr Pirt, Sir William Boothby, and Colonel St. John. At the Foot of a private Staircafe, which leads to a Part of the Palace, he was met by the fame Gentleman of the Bedchamber who had complimented him in the Name of his Sardinian Majesty, and in a Gallery at the Head of the Stairs, by the Grand Chambellan, who conducted his Royal Highnefs to an Apartment, where he was received by the King of Sardinia, the Duke of Chablais, and the Prince of Piedmont, the Duke of Savoy being confined to his Room by the Remains of a Fever and Cold, which has not yet left him. After fome Conversation with his Sardinian Majefly, his Royal Highnels was conducted by the Duke of Chablais and Prince of Piedmont, to the Duke and Dutchels of Savoy's Apartmen's, where his Royal Highnefs was received by the Reft of the Princes and Princeffes of this Royal Family. After this Ceremony, his Royal Highnels returned in the fame Manner to the Apartment where he had left the King, and was reconducted Home from thence in the fame Coaches.

From the Cordial Friendship which exists between the Two Courts, it is eafy to conceive with what Warmth of Regard his Royal Highness was received by his Sardinian Majefty and his Family, of which he continues to experience every Teffimony, by every poffible Mark of Attention and Effeem that can be shewn him; and his Royal Highness, on his Part, returns it in a Manner, which has already procured him the fincere Affection of the whole Court. Immediately uron his Royal Highness's Return, he was waited upon by the Prince of Carignan and his Son, and the next Day by the Great Officers, the Miniflers of State, the Knights of the Order of the Annunciation, and Thofe about the Court who are of the fame His Royal Highness then visited the Prince Rank. and Princefs of Carignan, as East of Ulfter, and continues to preserve his private Character.
