Information having been given, that several of His Majesty's Subjects, in the underwritten List particularly mentioned, have been for a considerable Time, and are now detained in France as Hostages for the Payment of Ransom Bills, which have not yet been satisfied; These are to give Notice, that in Case such Ransom-Bills are not forthwith discharged, Prosecutions will be commenced in His Majesty's Court of Admiralty against all Masters, Owners, and others, unjustly refusing or neglecting to pay the Sums of Money stipulated for the Release of those unfortunate Persons, who have suffered so long an Imprisonment.

Peterburg, March 20. The Empress returned Yesterday from Sarkafelo, where she passed some Days.

Copenhagen, April 3. The King of Denmark having appointed To-morrow for the Removal of the Court to Fridensburg, received Yesterday the usual Compliments on that Occasion, and was pleased to grant an Audience of Leave to Sir John Goodricke, His Britannick Majesty's Minister to the Court of Sweden, on his Departure to Stockholm.

Berlin, April 3. Last Friday his Royal Highness Prince Henry of Prussia arrived, from his Country Seat at Rhinsberg, in this Capital, where the King of Prussia is expected towards the End of this Week; when it is thought that Achmet Effendi, the Turkish Interronce, will have his Audience of Leave.

Frankfurt, April 3. The Archduke Joseph was crowned King of the Romans this Day, with great Pomp and Ceremony.

Hamburg, April 6. The British Factory here

was assembled on the 24th past, and elected Joseph Mellish, Esq; Governor of the Company of Merchants Adventurers, in the Room of the late John Gore, Esq;

Sunday next the 8th Instant. is the Day fixed upon by the Magistrates of this Republick, for celebrating the late Election of the King of the Romans: Te Deum will be sung in all the Churches; and the Cannon upon the Ramparts will be fired upon this joyful Event.
