Britain or Ireland, at any of the Places of his usual Refidence, or at the Place where he shall actually be at the Time of the Delivery thereos, or at either House of Parijament.

All fuch Letters and Packets as shall be fent from and to certain Perfons by Virtue of their Offices. under such Conditions, Restrictions, and Limitations, as in the faid Act is particularly expressed.

It is likewife Enacted, That all printed Votes, or Proceedings in Parliament, or printed News Papers. fent without Covers, or in Covers open at the Sides, figned on the Outfide thereof, by the Hand of any Member of Parliament, in fuch Manner as hath been heretofore practifed; or directed to any Member at any Place whereof he fhall have given Notice in Writing to the Poftmafter-General, or to his Deputy at Edinburgh or Dublin respectively, fhall pafs free of Poftage.

And alfo, That the Clerks in the Offices of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, and certain Officers in the Office of His Majefty's Poftmafter-General, may continue to Frank fuch printed Voies, and Proceedings in Parliament, and printed News Papers, in the Manner they have heretofore been accultomed, provided they be fent without Covers, or in Covers open at the Sides.

It is further Enacted, That any Officer employed under the Poftmafter-General, fhall have Power to examine and fearch any Packet fent without a Coveror in a Cover open at the Sides, in Order to difcover whether any other Paper or Thing whatfoever be inclofed or concealed in or with fuch printed Votes, Proceedings in Parliament, and printed News Papers; and in Cafe any fuch other Paper or Thing what foever, fhall be found in or with fuch printed Paper, or in Vafe there fhall be any Writing, other than the Superferietien upon fuch printed Paper, or upon the Cover thereof, the whole of fuch Packet fhall be charged with the Duty of Poftage.

And it is further Enacted, That if any Perfon shall, after the First Day of June next, counterfeit the Hand Writing of any Perfon whatfover in the Superfeription of any Letter, or Packet, to be fent by the Polt, in Order the cby to avoid the Payment of the Duty of Poltage, every Perfon fo offending, shall be deemed Guilty of Felony, and be transported for Seven Years.

And whereas many Letters directed to Members, are, in the Hurry of Bufinefs, charged with Poflage, chiefly for Want of the Words, Member of Parliament, being added to the Superfeription: It is therefore defired, that all Perfons correfponding with Members, would make that Addition, or diffinguifh them by M. P. at the Corner; and in Cafe any Letter or Packet, not exceeding the Weight of Two Ounces, fhould after every Precaution, happen to be charged, all Poftmafters are hereby directed, immediately to remit the Poftage to fuch Member, who is defired to return the Cover, when it can be conveniently done, as a Voucher to the Poftmafter, in paffing of his Accounts with this Office.

And whereas great Numbers of Letters are privately collected and delivered contrary to Law, to the Prejudice of the Revenue of this Office; all Carriers, Coachmen, Watermen, Wherrymen, Difpetfers of News Papers, Higlers, and all other Perfons what foever, hereafter detected in the illegnl collecting, conveying, or delivering of Letters and Packets, will be profecuted with the utmoft Severity. The Penalty is *Firm Pounds* for every Letter fo collected or delivered. contrary to Law, and One Hundred Pounds for every Week fuch Practice is continued: One Moiety to His Majefty, and the other to the Informer.
