Venice, April 27. The last Accounts received from Dalmatia are favourable, the Plague having ceased in all the Suburbs of Spaiato, and in the Districts of Clissa and Trau; and being now confined to the Territory of Sign only, the Republick has great Expectations of the entire Ceasing of that Calamity.
