Aranjuez, May 7.

M. Ifassi, a Colonel in this Service, is appointed Governour of New Orleans, and will probably be very soon sent thither.

The 3d Instant, Count Kaunitz and his Brother arrived here to notify the Election of the King of the Romans. General Wall arrived the same Day, and was received most graciously by his Catholick Majesty; and the Day after was invested with the Order of St. Januarius.

Venice, May 11. The Austrian Government in Itria has opened a free Communication with the Venetian Itria, which had been shut up by Sea, on Account of the Plague in Dalmatia; and the Proveditor Extraordinary in Itria has published a Proclamation, containing Orders and Rules for the Venetian Subjects, and particularly Fishermen on that Coast, for avoiding all Intercourse with such Places and Vessels, as might be dangerous by Reason of the Plague.

Florence, May 12. The Rejoicings here for the Election and Coronation of the King of the Romans are to begin To-morrow being the Empress's Birthday; they are to last for three Days: On the first Marshal Botta receives the Nobility in the Morning, and gives a Dinner: In the Afternoon Te Deum is to be sung, at which the Members of the Regency, and all the public Magistrates, are to assist; during which the Cannon of the Fortresses are to be discharged; and, in that and the two following Evenings, there are to be public Illuminations about the Town; and Marshal Botta makes an Assembly for the Ladies. The other two Days are to be distinguished by some Academical Exercises performed by the young Nobility; a Chariot Race; and a publick Ball in Mask in the Theatre, at the Expence of the Society of Gentlemen who are the perpetual Directors of that Theatre.

The Scarcity of Corn at Rome is greatly diminished by the considerable Supplies that have been received from Abroad at Civita Vecchia, and Ancona.

Turin, May 12. The Island of Sardinia being now in Want of Corn, this Court has ordered a considerable Quantity to be immediately sent into that Part of his Sardinian Majesty's Dominions, through the Genoese States; and they have also granted the Republick Leave to extract from Piedmont 5000 Bags of Corn for their own Use.

Copenhagen, May 15. We have received from Fridrickstadt in Norway, the melancholy News, that a Fire broke out there on the 1st Instant, which entirely consumed the whole Town: The Flames were so violent, that the Inhabitants had not Time to save any of their Effects. The Magazine of Powder was happily preserved.
