Prince Bariatinskoi arrived Stockbolm, May 15. here last Friday Night from Russia, with the Order of

St. Andrew for the Prince Royal. Stockholm, May 18. Lait Wednefday Morning Prince Bariatinfkoi had Audiences of the King of Sweden, and the reft of the Royal Family, at Dron-ningholm. After these were over, the King sent for the Prince Royal into his Clofet, and the Ruffian Envoys were called in along with their Secretary at this Court, who carried upon a Cushion the Order of St. Andrew: The Star and Crcis were richly of ot. Anotew The otar and Crois were fichly fet with Diamonds. Prince Bariatinfkoi took them off the Cufhion, and prefented them to the King, who invefted his Royal Highnefs with them himfelf.

Turin, May 19. On Thursday last the King of Sardinia, with the rest of the Royal Family, went to the Venerie, where they will remain to the End of June.

Berlin, May 22. Laft Sunday the King of Pruffia came from Potzdam, and on Monday, and this Morning, reviewed, in the Plain of Tempelhoff near this Place, Thirty Battalions of Infantry, Twelve Squadrons of Cavalry, and Ten of Huffars, making in all upwards of Twenty Thousand Men. His Royal Highness Prince Henry, his Prussian Majesty's Brother, commanded the Whole, as General of Infantry; and he had under him four Lieutenant Generals, of whom Prince Ferdinand, the King of Pruffia's Brother, was one: His Serene Highnefs the Hereditary Prince of Brunswick affisted at these Reviews. The King of Prussia will set out the End of this Week to Cultrin, Stargard, and Magdebourg, in order to review the Troops in those Provinces. His Majefty has made a Military Promotion of two Lieutenant Generals, and four Major Generals; and disposed of the vacant Regiments.
