The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order, that the Parliament, which stands Prorogued to Thursday the 21st of this Instant June, should be further Prorogued to Thursday the 16th Day of August next.

Naples, May 15. The Imperial Minister Count Kaunitz, who arrived here the 4th Instant, had on Thursday last an Audience of his Sicilian Majesty, when he presented his Credentials. The same Day Count Kinski took his Leave of his said Majesty, and set out last Saturday on his Return to the Court of Vienna, having before his Departure been presented with the King's Picture set with Diamonds. The Duke of Termoli, Son of Prince San Nicandro, who had lately been named to go to Vienna, to pay a Compliment in his Sicilian Majesty's Name to that Court, upon the Election of the King of the Romans, departed from hence Yesterday Morning.

We are at present so well provided here with Corn, that Orders have been sent to several Parts, to stop the Buying up any more, as there had been given unlimited Commissions; though in some of the Provinces the Want of Bread is still very great.

Genoa, May 19. On the 13th arrived in this Port His Britannick Majesty's Sloop the Vultur, from Cadiz and Marseilles.

Aranjuez, May 21. The Prince of Asturias has been a good deal indisposed, and obliged to keep his Bed; but is now out of Danger, and will soon appear again at Court.

The Marquis Paolucci arrived here the 16th, and has already had all his Audiences; and Yesterday Count Pogi, his Predecessor, had his Audiences of Leave.

Venice, May 23. Lord and Lady Spencer, Lord Palmerston and many other English, are come, and many more expected, to partake of the Festivals that will be given for the Entertainment of his Royal Highness the Duke of York.

Seeckhelm, May 25. The Consistory of this Diocese having met to make their Nomination of three Persons for the Archbishoprick of Upsal, the Majority fell upon the Bishops Serenius, Beronius, and Hilenius.

Turin, May 26. The Count de Pignatelli, who succeeds here the Marquis de Carraccioli as Envoy Extraordinary of the King of Naples at this Court, arrived here a Week ago from Lisbon, where he has long resided as his Neapolitan Majesty's Minister.

Berlin, May 29. The general Review of the Troops in this Neighbourhood being ended on the 22d Instant, His Prussian Majesty returned to Potz-

dam the same Evening, where he still continues, having been prevented by a slight Fit of the Gout from going to Custrin and Stargard; and it is said, that Generals Seydlitz and Ramin are appointed to review the Troops assembled at those Places.

Hague, June 5. Yesterday being His Britannick Majesty's Birth-Day, his Excellency Sir Joseph Yorke gave an Entertainment to the Foreign Ministers residing here, the People of Distinction of both Sexes of this Country, and a great Number of Foreigners; the Company did not separate till Four o'Clock this Morning.

Petersburg, May 15. The Empress set out Yesterday for Czarskoe Selo, where she proposes to remain about a Fortnight. Count Bestucheff has been very dangerously ill, but is now much better.

Cumberland House, June 5.

This Day M. de Grosse, Minister Plenipotentiary from the Empress of Russia, had a private Audience of his Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland.
