Naples, June 12. IS Sicilian Majelty's Indisposition having lasted but two or three Days, his Majesty dired again in publick on Sunday the 3d Inftant, when Count Lubienski, Envoy Extraordinary from Poland, had in the Morning his Audience of Leave, and a few Days after set out for Venice, where he is to execute the fame Com-miffion, with which he had been charged at this Court, and That of Rome.

On Sa'urday last the Orders were given for the Court's Return from Caferta on the 16th Instant; but initead of coming to Naples, his Sicilian Ma-jefty goes directly to Portici.

On the 31st of last Month his Sicilian Majesty performed the Ceremony of Invefting the Marquis Tanucci with the Enfigns of the Royal Order of St. Januarius; which Honour had lately been con-

ferred upon his Excellency by the Catholick King. Florence, June 19. His Royal Highnefs the Duke of York is expected here To morrow. Stockholm, June 22. The Prince Royal was at the Camp laft Tuefday to fee the Regiment of Guards exercife, and commanded one of the Battalions himfelf. On Wednesday the King and the Prince were in Town to review the Burghers, both Cavalry and Infantry, who performed their Exercife furprifingly well, and to the Satisfaction of all who were prefent. Next Week his Majefty will come to the Park, to make the General Review of the Guards; after which, it is supposed, the Camp will soon break up.
