ESTERDAY Morning the Senate were affembled at Dronningholm, when the Names of the three Candidates for the Archbishoprick of Upsal being laid before them, Beronius the Bishop of Calmar was unanimously elected to that Dignity; Dr. Serenius, who was the first upon the Nomination, having declined it.

In the Evening there was a Court, when Count Unroh, who is come hither with a Commission from the Protestants in Poland, was presented to the King and Royal Family.

The King came this Afternoon to the Camp near this Town, to review the Regiment of Guards; and expressed great Satisfaction at the Manner in which they went through the Exercise.
