To be fhewn and enter'd at Verrall's Coffee Houfe in Lewes, on Wednefday the zad Day of Auguft next, or they are not to run for the faid Plate: And if any Difference arifes relating to their Ages, Entering, or Running, the fame to be determined by his Grace the Duke of Newcafle, or whom he fhall appoint, according to fuch His Majefty's Orders or Rules, as thall be produced at the Place of Entering or Running for the faid Plate.
