To the King's most Excellent Majesty.

The humble Address of the Prefident and Commander in Chief, the Council, and Affembly of your Bermuda or Sommer Islands.

Most gracious Sovereign, V E your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Sub-jects, the President, Council, and Assembly of your Bermuda Illands, humbly beg Leave to congratulate your Majesty, with the warmest Sentiments of Regard and Affection, for your Paternal Care and unwearied Fortitude in Supporting a long and fuc-celsful War for the Honour of the Crown and true Happinels of your People. After your Majefty was pleased to pursue every laudable Measure that could contribute to the Glory and Security of your extensive Dominions, you have at last, by your conformate Prudence and Wisdom, procured us a safe, honour-able, and, we hope, a lasting Peace.

And we take Leave to express the most permanent and unfeigned Joy on the Birth of a Second Prince to your Illustrious and August House; an Event which we effecem as an additional Strength to the prefent happy Establishment, and a further Prop and Security to our excellent Conflitution in Church and State. Permit us, though remote, to confels, that the happy Influence of your Majesty's mild and conflicutional Government enables us to tafte the the Sweets of Liberty; in fuch a Situation, must we not admire that Goodness of Heart that diffinguishes You as a humane, benevolent, and amiable Prince? As your Arms have been a Scourge, fo may your confpicuous and thining Virtues unite your Subjects in the highest Sentiments of Loyalty and Affection. May your Majesty's unwearied Endeavours prove fuccefsful in procuring to your Kingdoms, and their Ap-pendages, the invaluable Bleffings of Peace; may your Royal Example teach your Subjects to enjoy Freedom without Licentiousness; and that the innumerable Bleffings we reap under your aufpicious

Reign, may for a long Series of Ages be continued to our Posterity in your Illustrious Line.

Turin, July 11. His Royal Highness the Duke of York arrived here this Morning, and was met at some Diftance from this Place by the Master of the Ceremonies, and his Deputy, in two of his Sardinian Majefty's Coaches, and conducted to the Palace prepared for his Reception; and foon after received the Compliments upon his fafe Arrival, on the Part of the King, the Duke of Savoy, and the reft of the Royal Family; to all of whom his Royal Highness a few Hours after paid his Vifit, which was received with all the Marks of Friendship and Cordiality.

Stockholm, July 13. The Empress of Russia has fent a Present to the Queen of Sweden of Six Horses from the Ukraine; and her Majesty came on Wednefday to Carlberg to fee them : There are three Saddle Horfes, and three for the Sledge. Prince Bariatinskoi has received the King's Picture set with Diamonds ; as also a Gold Snuff box, in the Lid of which is the Prince Royal's Picture, furrounded like-wife with Diamonds; and the Day he took Leave, the King made him a Knight of the Order of the Sword.

Berlin, July 21. M. Badouin, the Profilan Secretary of Legation, fet out from hence Yesterday for England. The King and Prince Royal of Pruffia, accompanied by the Duke and Dutchefs of Brunswick, the Hereditary Prince and Princefs, and the Princeffes Elizabeth and Augusta of Brunswick, came from Potzdam to Charlottenbourg on the 16th Inflant. The fame Day Count Finckenstein acquainted the Fo. reign Ministers refiding at this Court, with the intend-ed Marriage of the Prince Royal of Pruffin with the Prince's Elizabeth of Brunswick, adding, that his Pruffian Majefty would be pleafed to fee the Mi-nifters at Charlottenbourg, to fhare in the Diverfions that were to be given on this Occafion. On the 18th Inftant the Ceremony of Betrothing was per-formed; and in the Evening there was an Affembly, the Garden being illuminated; and after Supper there was a Ball, which lafted till Morning.
