The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to Order, That the Parliament, which stands Prorogued to Thursday the 16th of this Instant August, should be further Prorogued to Tuesday the 30th Day of October next.

Petersbourg, July 13. The Empress set out on Sunday for *Riga*: Her Imperial Majesty passed three Days at *Cronstadt*; the Weather was very favourable, and the Fleet made a magnificent Appearance.

The Vice-Chancellor, whose Father is lately dead, is going to *Moscow* for a Fortnight. The Great Duke sets out To-morrow for *Sarkoe Szlo*.

Prince *Augustus Lobkowitz*, who came from *Vienna* with the Account of the Election of the King of the Romans, has had his Audience of Leave.

Dresden, July 22. A Resolution having been taken to rebuild the Great Protestant Church here, which was entirely demolished by the Prussian Bombardment, the Prince Administrator, accompanied by all the Ministers of State, performed, last Monday, with great Pomp and Devotion, the Ceremony of laying the First Stone.

Hague, July 27. *M. Moser* is arrived here, and has delivered his Credentials to the President of the Week, as Minister Plenipotentiary from the Landgrave of *Hesse-Cassel* to the States-General.
