WE hear that the Review, which was to have been on the 27th Instant at Potsdam, is deferred till the 8th of next Month, on Account of a Great Assembly of the Knights of the Order of St. John of Jerusalem, which is to be held at Sornnebourg on the 1st of October, when, 'tis said, upwards of Sixty young Prussian Noblemen will be created Knights of that Order.

Princess Amelia, the King of Prussia's Sister, who has been, for several Months past, drinking the Waters at Spa, for the Recovery of her Health, arrived two Days ago at Potsdam; and her Royal Highness is hourly expected in this Capital.
