in him by the faid Acts of Parliament, and by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, direct and appoint, that the Moiety, or o her Part of all and every the Seizure and Seizures that have been, or fhall be made by Vitue of the first mentioned Act, and granted to the Officers and Seamen as aforefaid, and the Moiety of Seizures granted by the faid last mentioned Act, be divided in the following Proportions, viz.

ing Proportions, viz. 1ft. With Regard to Seizures made by the Officers and Men of Ships and Sloops of War.

To the Captain or Captains of any fuch Ships or Sloops who shall be actually on Board at the Seizure of any Smuggling Veffel or prohibited Goods, Three Eighth Parts, to be equally divided amongst them : To the Captains of Marines and Land Forces, Sea Lieutenants and Masters on Board any fuch Ships or Sloops, One Eighth Part, to be equally divided amongst them : To the Lieutenants and Quarter Masters of Marines, and Lieutenants, Enligns, and Quarter Ma-fters of Land Forces, Boatswain, Gunner, Purser, Carpenter, Master's Mate, Surgeon, Pilot, and Chaplain, on Board any fuch Ships or Sloops, One Eighth Part, to be equally divided amongst them : To the Midshipmen, Secretary to Flag Öfficers, Captain's Clerk, Master Sailmaker, Carpenter's Mates, Boatfwain's Mates, Gunner's Mates, Master at Arms, Corporals, Yeomen of the Sheets, Coxsivain, Quarter Masters, Quarter Master's Mates, Surgeon's Mates, Yeomen of the Powder Room, and Serjeants of Marines, or Land Forces on Board any fuch Ships or Sloops, One Eighth Part to be equally divided amongst them : To the Trumpeters, Quarter Gunners, Car-penter's Crew, Steward, Cook, Armourer, Steward's Mate, Cook's Mate, Gunfmith, Cooper, Swabber, Ordinary Trumpeter, Barber, Able Seamen, Ordinary Seamen, and Marine, or other Soldiers, and all other Perfons doing Duty, or affifting on Board any fuch Ships or Sloops, Two Eighth Parts, to be equally divided amongst them.

2d. With Regard to Seizures made by the Officers and Men of Cutters commanded by Lieutenants.

To the Lieutenant commanding fuch Cutter, who fhall be actually on Board at the Seizure of any Smuggling Veffel, or Prohibited Goods, One Half Part: To the Second Mafter and Pilot, or Mafter's Mate and the Midfhipmen on Board any fuch Cutter, One Eighth Part: The Second Mafter and Pilot, or Mafter's Mate, to have Two Third Parts thereof, and the Midfhipman to have the Remainder; but if there fhould happen to be a Pilot Extraordinary on Board at the making of any fuch Seizure, the Second Mafter and Pilot, or Mafter's Mate, is, in that Cafe, to have one Moiety of the faid Eighth Part, and the other Moiety is to be equally divided between the Pilot Extraordinary and Midfhipman: To the Clerk and Steward, Boatfwain's Mate, Gunner's Mate, Carpenter's Mate, and Surgeon's Mate on Board any fuch Cutter, One Eighth Part: To the Able Seamen, Ordinary Seamen, and all other Perfons doing Duty and affifting on Board any fuch Cutter, Two Eighth Parts, to be equally divided amongft them.

3d. With regard to Seizures made by Ships or Sloops of War in Conjunction with Cutters.

That in all fuch Cafes, the Molety or other Part which is given to the Officers and Men who fhall make fuch Seizure, be divided into fo many equal Parts or Shares, as there may be Ships or Sloops and Cutters concerned therein; and that those Shares be distributed to the Officers and Men of the Ships or Sloops and Cutters according to the aforegoing Proportions.

And His Majefly doth hereby further order, direct, and appoint, That in the Cafe of Seizures made at

Sea in any of the Colouies Abroad, belonging to $t^{1} \notin$ Crown of Great Britain, by His Majefty's Chips or Vessels, being Part of the Sanadron, or acting under the Orders of a Flag Officer, or a Commodore with a Captain under him, fuch Flag Officer or Commodore shall have One Fourth Part of the Molecy or other Part of the faid Seizures directed by the faid Lift mentioned A& to be paid to the Collector of His Majefty's Cultoms, or referved by former Acts for His Majefly's Ufe: And in Cafe any Sea Captain, in-ferior Commiftion or Warrant Sea Officers, belonging, to any fuch Ship or Veffel, for whom any Shares of Seizures are hereby allowed, be absent at the Time of making fuch Seizure, the Share of fuch Sea Captain, inferior Commission or Warrant Sea Officer, shall be cast into the Shares hereby allowed to the Trumpeters, Quarter Gunners, Carpenter's Crew, Steward, Cook, Armourer, Steward's Mate, Cook's Mate, Gunsmith, Cooper, Swabber, Ordinary Trumpeter, Barber, Able Seamen, Ordinary Seamen, and Marine or other Soldiers, and all other Perfons doing Duty or affifting on board any fuch Ship or Veffel, to be equally divided amongst them : Provided, that if any Officer or Officers on Board of any fuch Ship or Sloops at the Time of making fuch Seizures, shall have more Commissions or Offices than One, he or they shall be intitled only to the Share which, according to the abovementioned Distribution, shall belong to his or their respective superior Commissions or Offices. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to caufe His Majefty's Pleafure hereby fignified, to be duly complied with.
