Berlin, November 17.

THE King of Prussia still remains at Potsdam; and his Brother Prince Henry continues at his Country-House at Rhinberg.

Hague, November 23. The Prince and Princess of Nassau-Weilbourg, with their Family, arrived here in good Health from Germany, on the 20th Instant, at Night.

York House, November 25.

This Day Count Bruhl, Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of Saxony;

And the Chevalier Stapleton, Minister Plenipotentiary from the Duke of Wurtemberg, had their first Private Audience of his Royal Highness the Duke of York.

St. James's, November 22, 1764.
