**Y**ESTERDAY being her Royal Highness the Princess Dowager of Wales's Birthday, their Majesties received the Compliments of the Nobility and Foreign Ministers upon that Occasion at St. James's. The Nobility, &c. made their Compliments to her Royal Highness at Carlton House.

St. James's, November 22, 1764.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That, on Saturday Night last, the House of his Grace the Duke of Norfolk, in St. James's Square, was, by some daring Robber or Robbers, feloniously and burglariously broke and entered, by Means of a Ladder placed in the Robin-Hood Yard, which leads to the back Part of the said House, from whence the said Robber or Robbers most audaciously got into the Window of her Grace's Closet, and from thence into her Dressing-Room, and took therefrom One Piece of Foreign Lustring, of a light blue Colour: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the above Crimes, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of them, (except the Person who actually committed the said Felony and Burglary) who shall discover his, or her, Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
