Berlin, November 20. The King of Prussia still continues at Potzdam, and, it is said, will not come here till the Middle of next Month. On Saturday Evening, his Royal Highness Prince Ferdinand of Prussia, Grand Master of the Order of St. John of Jerusalem, arrived here with the Princess his Confort, from Rhinsberg, where they had spent some Time with his Royal Highness Prince Henry.

Berlin, November 24. M. de Meynertthagen, Envoy Extraordinary from the States General to the Court of Russia, arrived here last Night from Petersbourg; and proposes staying a few Days at this Place, before he proceeds on his Journey to the Hague.
