**T**HE whole Royal Family came to Town from Dronningholm on Wednesday Evening for the Winter, and were last Night at the French Comedy.

*Dresden, November 18.* The Marquis de Bauffet, Minister Plenipotentiary from the Court of France to that of Russia, arrived here on the 7th Instant; and set out again Yesterday on his Way to Petersburg.

*Berlin, November 20.* The King of Prussia still continues at Potzdam, and, it is said, will not come here till the Middle of next Month. On Saturday Evening, his Royal Highness Prince Ferdinand of Prussia, Grand Master of the Order of St. John of Jerusalem, arrived here with the Princess his Consort, from Rhinsberg, where they had spent some Time with his Royal Highness Prince Henry.

*Berlin, November 24.* M. de Meynertshagen, Envoy Extraordinary from the States General to the Court of Russia, arrived here last Night from Petersburg; and proposes staying a few Days at this Place, before he proceeds on his Journey to the Hague.

*Hamburg, November 23.* On the 11th Instant a most dreadful Fire broke out at Konigberg in a Magazine, as it is said, of Hemp and Flax, and had consumed upwards of 400 Houses.

*Hague, November 30.* M. Dedel, who has been named Ambassador from the Republick to the Ottoman Porte, has taken Leave of the States General; and will set out for Constantinople some Time next Week.

*St. James's, December 4.*

The King has been pleased to grant unto Sir Thomas Sewell, Knight, the Office of Master or Keeper of the Rolls and Records in the Court of Chancery, in the room of Sir Thomas Clarke, deceased.

And as a further Encouragement, I, Edward Duke of Norfolk, do hereby, promise a Reward of One Hundred Pounds to any Person or Persons, making such Discovery as aforesaid, except as above excepted; to be paid, by me, upon the Conviction of one or more of the Offenders. **NORFOLK.**
