Copenhagen, November 20.

ON Monday the 9th Instant her Royal Highness the Princess Louisa was publickly confirmed in the Chapel belonging to the Palace of Fredericksburgh. Their Danish Majesties, and the whole Court, were present at this Solemnity, and were greatly pleased with the Manner in which the Princess went through the strict Examination usual on these Occasions.

Count Raventlau, Governor to his Royal Highness the Prince of Denmark, is appointed Commissioner of the Finances, in the Room of M. d'Ahlefeldt, who is named Grand Bailiff of Pinneburg.

Dresden, November 25. Abbé Victor, who was Governor to the Elector, was last Wednesday dismissed from his Employment, and M. de Forel, a Commandeur of the Order of Malta, who was formerly Governor to the Administrator and Prince Charles, is appointed Governor and Grand Master in his room.

Copenhagen, November 27. Their Danish Majesties removed to the Palace here on Friday last, in perfect Health. To-morrow, being the Queen-Mother's Birth-day, will be celebrated in the usual Manner.

Dublin, December 1.

Yesterday being the Anniversary of the Birth of her Royal Highness the Princess Dowager of Wales, the Great Guns in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments on Duty, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks: At Noon there was a numerous and splendid Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction at the Castle, to compliment their Excellencies the Lords Justices on the Occasion: In the Evening there was a Play given by their Excellencies, for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy throughout the City.
