THIS Republick are using all Means possible to lessen their Expences: They have reformed One Hundred Canoneers; and reduced their whole Military Strength to Five Regiments of Soldiers.

Venice, November 21. Procurator Morosini, Brother to him who was one of the last Venetian Ambassadors in England, died lately at Parma, on a Tour he was taking through Italy. It is said the Republick will make some Regulations upon this Occasion, for limiting the vast Expences which the Procurators of St. Mark are obliged to make upon their Election.

Count Durazzo, the new Imperial Ambassador, is come to Town; and, as soon as his Apartments can be got ready, he will notify his Arrival to the other Foreign Ministers.

St. James's, November 22, 1764.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That, on Saturday Night last, the House of his Grace the Duke of Norfolk, in St. James's Square, was, by some daring Robber or Robbers, feloniously and burglariously broke and entered, by Means of a Ladder placed in the Robin-Hood Yard, which leads to the back Part of the said House, from whence the said Robber or Robbers most audaciously got into the Window of her Grace's Closet, and from thence into her Dressing-Room, and took therefrom One Piece of Foreign Lustring, of a light blue Colour: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the above Crimes, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of them, (except the Person who actually committed the said Felony and Burglary) who shall discover his, or her, Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
