THIS Day his Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester was, by His Majesty's Command, introduced into the Privy Council by his Grace the Duke of Bedford, Lord President; and his Royal Highness took his Place at the Council Board.

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 12th Day of October last, to order, permit, and authorize the Importation of Salted Beef, Salted Pork, Bacon, and Butter, from Ireland, into that Part of the Kingdom of Great Britain called England (pursuant to the Powers vested in His Majesty for that Purpose, during the present Recess, by an Act passed the last Session of Parliament) until and provided the same be landed in any of the Ports of that Part of the said Kingdom of Great Britain called England, on or before the Thirty-first Day of this Instant December — And whereas the Time thereby limited for the Importation of the said Salted Provisions is now near expiring; and it being judged expedient that the same should be continued for as long Time as His Majesty by the said Act is empowered to permit the same — His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore Order, and it is hereby accordingly Ordered, that the Time limited by the said Proclamation, for the Importation of Salted Beef, Salted Pork, Bacon, and Butter, from Ireland, be prolonged and extended to the Ninth Day of January next inclusive. Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice.

Venice, December 5. On Sunday last Signor Giovanni Marco Calvo, Member of the Council of Ten, was chosen by the Great Council Procuratore of St. Mark's, in the room of Procuratore Microlini, lately deceased.

Dantzic, December 8. On the 6th Instant Sir George Macartney, His Britannick Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary to the Court of Russia, set out from hence for Petersburg, where he hoped to arrive on the 20th or 22d of this Month, a hard Frost having made the Roads very fine for Travelling.

Berlin, December 11. The King of Prussia is perfectly recovered from his Fit of the Gout, and is expected here the 15th or 16th Instant.

Hambourg, December 14. On the 11th Instant Prince Henry of Prussia arrived here, and, after having examined every Thing worth seeing in this City, he set out again this Afternoon by the Road of Berlin. His Royal Highness, during his Stay here, remained incognito, and admitted no Visits.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint Montfort Browne, Esq; to be Lieutenant-Governor of West Florida in America.
