HEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 12th Day of October last, to order, permit, and au-thorize the Insportation of Salted Beef, Salted Pork, Bacon, and Butter, from Ireland, into that Part of the Kingdom of Great Britain called England (purfuant to the Powers velled in His Majefly for that Purpole, during the prelent Recefs, by an A& paffed the laft Seffion of Parliament) until and provided the fame te landed in any of the Ports of that Part of the faid Kingdom of Great Britain called England, on or before the Thirty-first Day of this Instant December - And whereas the Time thereby limited for the Inportation of the faid Saited Provisions is now near expiring; and it being judged expedient that the fame should be continued for as long Time as His Majefty by the faid Act is empowered to permi the fame-His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore Order, and it is hereby accordingly Ordered. that the Time limitted by the faid Proclamation, for the Importation of Salted Beef, Salted Pork, Bacon, and Butter, from Ireland. be proloaged and extended to the Ninth Day of January next inclusive. Whereof all Perlons concerned are to take Notice.

PUrfuant to an Act of Parliament palled in the Twenty-fixth Year of His late Majefly's Reign, This is to give Notice to the Concerned, That Information hath been fent to this Office, That the Snow, called the George, of the Burthen of 130 Tons, or thereabouts, whereof James Gardner was Mafter, bound from Liverpool to Helvoetfluys, and from thence to the Coaft of Africa, laden with Linnen, Iron, Brandy, and empty Cafks, did, on the 5th Inftant, in flormy Weather, drive on Shore near Jews Gutt, about the Diftance of Four Miles to the Eastward of Rye Harbour, and immediately broke to Pieces; but that Part of the Cargo is faved, and fecured at Lydd in the County of Kent, under the Care of Meff. Minett and Company, Merchants at Dover, and of the Officers of His Majefly's Cuf-toms; and that the faid Veffel and her Cargo were the Property of George Campbell and Sons, Merchants at Liverpool, and were configned to the faid James Gardner,

Information hath also been fent to this Office, That the Ship Endracht, of Amtlerdam, whereof Thys Dirkfz was Maller, of the Butthen of about 260 Tons, laden with Coffee and Cocoa, bound from Surinam in the West Indies to Amsterdan, was on the 5th Instant, in clowing, thick, and dark Weather, driven on Shore about Four Miles to the West of Dungeness on the Coast of Kent, where she lay wrecked on the 11th Instant; That her Cargo and Lading were then taking out for the Benefit of the Owners; and that the faid Ship was the Property of John Jacob Faech the Younger.
