AT the Court at St. James's, the 12th Day of December, 1764,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 12th Day of October last, to order, permit, and authorize the Importation of Salted Beef, Salted Pork, Bacon, and Butter, from Ireland, into that Part of the Kingdom of Great Britain called England (pursuant to the Powers vested in His Majesty for that Purpose, during the present Recess, by an Act passed the last Session of Parliament) until and provided the same be landed in any of the Ports of that Part of the said Kingdom of Great Britain called England, on or before the Thirty-first Day of this Instant December. — And whereas the Time thereby limited for the Importation of the said Salted Provisions is now near expiring; and it being judged expedient that the same should be continued for as long Time as His Majesty by the said Act is empowered to permit the same—His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore Order, and it is hereby accordingly Ordered, that the Time limited by the said Proclamation, for the Importation of Salted Beef, Salted Pork, Bacon, and Butter, from Ireland, be prolonged and extended to the Ninth Day of January next inclusive. Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice.

Warsaw, December 5. The Day before Yesterday the Diet assembled, and the Election of the Marshal was made the same Afternoon in the Person of Count Malachowski, Starost of Pehicaw. Yesterday, by the Recommendation, and in the Presence of the two Chambers, the three vacant Seals of Great Chancellor, and Vice Chancellor, of the Crown, and of Vice Chancellor of Lithuania, were disposed of. This Ceremony was performed with great Dignity, the King, from the Throne, making a most eloquent Speech on that Occasion.

The Palatinate of Wilna is given to Count Oginski, who is lately returned from St. Petersburg.

The Prussian Ambassador has delivered his Letters of Recall, and will leave this Place in a Day or two. His Majesty has presented him with his Picture richly set with Diamonds.

Stockholm, December 7. The Senator Count Bonde died on Wednesday last; which makes a second Vacancy in the Senate.

Berlin, December 15. This Morning the King of Prussia arrived here in perfect Health from Potsdam, accompanied by his Royal Highness the Prince of Prussia, and young Prince Henry. Baron Platho, his Russian Majesty's Minister at Ratibon, is also arrived here.

Hamburgh, December 21. A few Days ago M. de Meynershagen, Envoy Extraordinary from the States General to the Empress of Russia, arrived here from Petersburg in his Way to Holland.

We hear from Lubeck, that on the 14th Instant, at Night, a great Fire broke out there in the House of a Sugar Baker, which entirely consumed the same; and the Church of St. Peter, which stood near it, would have been destroyed, if they had not pulled down the Steeple, whereby the Progress of the Flames was stopt, and the Fire was fortunately extinguished about Eight o'Clock the next Morning.

The Mortality among the Horned Cattle is broke out again in Holstein.
