AT the Court at St. James's, the 12th Day of December, 1764,

PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council. W HEREAS His Majefty was pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 12th Day of October last, to order, permit, and au-thorize the Importation of Salted Beef, Salted Pork, Bacon, and Butter, from Ireland, into that Part of the Kingdom of Great Britain called England (pursuant to the Powers vested in His Majesty for that Purpofe, during the prefent Receis, by an Act paffed the laft Seffion of Parliament) until and provided the fame be landed in any of the Ports of that Part of the faid Kingdom of Great Britain called England, on or before the Thirty-first Day of this Instant December. - And whereas the Time thereby limitted for the Importation of the faid Salted Provisions is now near expiring; and it being judged expedient that the fame should be continued for as long Time as His Majesty by the faid Act is empowered to per-mit the fame-His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore Order, and it is hereby accordingly Ordered, that the Time limitted by the faid Proclamation, for the Importation of Salted Beef, Salted Pork, Bacon, and Butter, from Ireland, be prolonged and extended to the Ninth Day of January next inclusive. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice.

Warfaw, December 5. The Day before Yesterday the Diet assembled, and the Election of the Marshal was made the fame Afternoon in the Perfon of Count Malachowski, Staroft of Pehicaw. Stockholm, December 7. The Senator Count Bonde died on Wednesday last; which makes a fecond Vacancy in the Senate.

Berlin, December 15. This Morning the King of Profia arrived here in perfect Health from Potzdam, accompanied by his Royal Highnels the Prince of Pruffia, and young Prince Henry. Baron Plotho, his Rruffian Majelty's Minister at Ratifbon, is also arrived here.

A few Days ago M. Hamburgh, December 21. de Meynershagen, Envoy Extraordinary from the States General to the Empress of Russia, arrived here from Petersburgh in his Way to Holland.

We hear from Lubeck, that on the 14th Instant, at Night, a great Fire broke out there in the Houfe of a Sugar Baker, which entirely conlumed the fame; and the Church of St. Peter, which flood near it, would have been deftroyed, if they had not pulled down the Steeple, whereby the Progress of the Fire was former by the Flames was flopt, and the Fire was fortunately extinguished about Eight o'Clock the next Morning.
