### Dresden, December 16.

A R O N Stutterheim, who was fome Time ago named Envoy Exrraordinary from this Court to That of Berlin, fet out Yesterday for his Place of Refidence. Count Sternberg, the Imperial Minister, has taken his Audiences of Leave, and goes from hence on Tuefday Morning. Prince Charles is perfectly recovered, and goes To-morrow to Hubertsburg, for three or four Days, on a Hunting Party.

Berlin, December 22. Laft Tuesday his Royal Highnels Prince Henry, the King of Pruffia's Brother, arrived here from the Tour he had made to Brunswick and Hamburgh.

Baron Stutterheim, Minister to this Court from That of Dresden, arrived here on the 20th Inftant ; and Yesterday Morning he had his first Audience of the King of Pruffia, and delivered his Letters of Credence.

Last Night Major General Nugent, who is to re-place General Reidt as Minister to this Court from That of Vienna, arrived here.

Thursday last there was a Grand Meeting of the Members of the Royal Academy of this Place, when the Princes Frederick Augustus, and William Adolphus of Brunfwick, who are in the Pruffian Service, were cholen and received, with great Solemnity, Members of the faid Academy. Their Serene Highnefles pronounced, each, a thort Harangue, on this Occasion.
