**Y**ESTERDAY Morning a Courier arrived here from Russia, who brought Count Osterman the Order of St. Anne, with which he appeared last Night at Court.

*Copenhagen, January 8.* M. de Sprengporten, Minister from Sweden, is set out for Stockholm to assist at the Diet; and M. de Scheven, Secretary of Legation, remains Chargé des Affaires during his Absence.

*Berlin, January 8.* M. de Reidt, who resided at this Court in the Character of Envoy Extraordinary from the Empress Queen, set out Yesterday for Vienna.

*Berlin, January 12.* Count Woronzow, Great Chancellor of Russia, who has been here ever since the 2d of November last, set out Yesterday on his Return to Petersburg.

*Bonn, January 10.* At Eleven this Morning the Elector of Cologne, accompanied only by the Marquis of Trotti, Master of Horse, and three Chamberlains, set out for Munster. His Electoral Highness lies this Night at Zons, three Leagues from Cologne; To-morrow at Dorsten, and on Saturday at Munster.

His Highness remains in Westphalia till the Holy Week, when he returns to assist at the Diet, which is to be held here much about that Time.
