Petersbourg, December 31. Sir George Martcrtney, His Britannick Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary to this Court, arrived here on Thursday last.

Naples, January 1. His Sicilian Majesty arrived in this Capital on the 25th of December; and the next Day there was a Baccio Manos. His Majesty has been twice at the Opera.

Florence, January 12. This Government is employed in making Dispositions for the Reception of the Arch-Duke, who is to have the Title of Governor and Captain General of the whole Dutchy.

The Arch-Duke's Court is to be composed of four principal Officers, the Maggior Domo Maggiore, the Great Chamberlain, the Captain of the Garde Noble, and the first Ecuyer, (instead of a Grand Ecuyer,) of this last Employment the Grand Prior Corfini has already taken Possession; and is now settled here, in order to make the Dispositions that depend upon it for the Arch-Duke's Arrival. Many of the Nobility have already the Title of Chamberlain to the Emperor, in which Quality they are to attend the Arch-Duke.

Marshal Botta has at present the sole Direction of the Reparations and Additions that are making to the Palace, which are very considerable, as well as of the Furniture, Coaches, and other Necessaries.

Vienna, January 16. Madame de Linden, appointed Grande Maitresse to the future Queen of the Romans, Mess. Salin and Sternberg the two Grand Maitres, three of the Dames de Cour, and four Chambellans, set out from hence Yesterday, to receive the Princess of Bavaria at the Frontiers, and attend her hither.

Vienna, January 19. On Wednesday last General Minuze arrived here from Munich, with the agreeable News that the King of the Romans Marriage had been celebrated there the Sunday before. The next Day their Imperial Majesties, and the King of the Romans, received the Compliments of the Ambassadors, Foreign Ministers, and principal Nobility; and in the Evening there was a Bal paré at Court in grand Gala.

The King of the Romans set out this Morning for Lintz to meet his Queen.

Copenhagen, January 19. The intended Nuptials of their Royal Highnesses the Prince Royal and the Princess Caroline Matilda of England, were declared at Court Yesterday. There was a very brilliant Ball, and Supper at the Royal Table, on this Occasion; and the Evening concluded with Illuminations, and every possible Demonstration of Joy from all Ranks of People.

General Houck is appointed Commandant of the Fortrefs of Croonenburg, and General d'Ahlefeldt is named to succeed that Gentleman in the War Directory. Count Gaspar Moltke, one of the Grand Marshal's Sons, has also left that Board on his being appointed to command a Regiment of Dragoons.

Berlin, January 19. Yesterday being the Birth-day of Prince Henry the King of Prussia's Brother, the Chief Nobility and Gentry, as also the Foreign Ministers at this Court, waited in the Morning on his Royal Highness, and paid him the usual Compliments on the Occasion.

Berlin, January 22. Last Sunday the Margrave of Schwedt arrived in this Capital, from his Country Seat at Schwedt.

Hamburgh, January 25. On Thursday the 17th Instant, Senator Rumpff was elected a Burgher-master of this City in the room of M. Corthum, lately deceased; and his Place of Senator has since been filled up by the Election of M. Van Sichen, a Lawyer.
