Berlin, January 26.

LAST Thursday being the King of Prussia's Birth-day, his Majesty had in the Morning a very splendid Levée, when he received the usual Compliments from the Royal Family and Nobility here: His Majesty afterwards dined with his Brother Prince Henry, who gave, in the Evening, in Honour of the Day, a publick Masquerade, which was extremely numerous and magnificent, and lasted till Seven o'Clock next Morning.
